Notes:

- To date, no Measles cases have been confirmed in the Panhandle Health District. However, two confirmed Measles cases have been identified in Latah County which is in Health District 2. No exposure risks from these two cases have been identified in the Panhandle Health District.
- One case of Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever was investigated in May. A recent tick bite was recalled by the individual.
- Enhanced Hepatitis A and B vaccine program for high risk groups begun in May.
- RSV, CRE, LTBI, TB (B1 and B2 notifications), and, invasive MRSA cases are laboratory reportable only. These cases are not included in yearend numbers.
