Notes:

- The number of Shiga-toxin E. coli cases continues to remain elevated. Investigations on-going to try and establish a link.
- One case of Dengue Fever reported. Travel history to Central America with mosquito bites.
- One case of Rat Bite Fever. History of being bitten by a rodent.
- No confirmed or probable cases of Measles reported in our district this year. Several cases reported in Health District 2 this summer with no local community spread.
- RSV, CRE, LTBI, TB (B1 and B2 notifications), and, invasive MRSA cases are laboratory reportable only. These cases are not included in yearend numbers.
