

- Influenza activity starting to increase in the district. Still has not reached the threshold to declare active flu season yet.
  - Increase in Elevated Blood lead reports this month due to yearly childhood blood lead testing program in the Silver Valley.
  - Chlamydia cases down, Gonorrhea and Syphilis cases up this month.
  - RSV, CRE, Coccidiomycosis, LTBI, TB (B1 and B2 notifications), and, invasive MRSA cases are laboratory reportable only. These cases are not included in yearend numbers.

- Current Outbreaks:**
- **2019-102:** Several cases of MDRO in a skilled nursing facility.
  - **2019-103:** Gastroenteritis outbreak in a long-term care facility.
