

Notes:

- The PHD influenza surveillance program has met the positivity threshold and has declared it Active Influenza season.
- One case of probable infant botulism. Infant is currently hospitalized. Case is under investigation.
- One suspect Measles case was reported and investigated. Confirmatory tests were negative.
- RSV, CRE, LTBI, TB (B1 and B2 notifications), and, invasive MRSA cases are laboratory reportable only. These cases are not included in yearend numbers.
