DHW Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Since Mike Wraith was out of the office, Leah Moeller supplied an update on the Mobile Crisis Unit. She stated they are continuing to meet with CIT. • RBHB Board call this month Rosie, Program Specialist very instrumental in working with the OPIOID grant. She would like to sit in on some of the meetings. Housing Committee should have a conversation with Rosie in the future.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Joyce Broadsword shared that the Dept of Health and Welfare is re-vamping their website which was supposed to be live by Friday. It should be much more user friendly than before.
<p>Presentations</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Starr Shephard spoke on the general COVID Now Hotline, DHW Covid 19 Hotline Support. Coronavirus Counseling Assistance for Frontline Workers (CCAFW) Assistance for front line workers call line, to help them navigate through their mental health through their work issues; offers 5 sessions through them. Camille McCashland - Amy introduced Camille, the grant director for the Partnership of Success Grant through the Department of Drug Policy. In 2013 received Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant. Provided funding 16 community coalitions. Then in 2018 came the Partnership for Success Grant. It is a five-year grant from SAMHSA and the grant is currently into the 3rd year. Purpose was to address underage drinking between 9 and 20-year olds. But, they identified two other substances they wanted to focus on; methamphetamine and marijuana use. Determined to work with the 7 regional Behavioral Health Boards in partnership with public health districts. Partner with Law enforcement agencies. Work with Kootenai County Sheriff and Spirit Lake PD. She reviewed the goals of the program. 1, strengthen prevention capacity and infrastructure at the state, regional and community level; 2. Reduce the prevalence of past 30-day alcohol use among Idahoans aged 12 – 18 in all 7 public health regions; 3 reduce past months marijuana use among Idahoans aged 12 and older in RBHB 1, 3 and 5; and 4, reduce prevalence of past year meth use among Idahoans in RBHB regions 1, 2, 3, 4, and 6. <p>Presented the strategic evidence-based framework model. She reviewed the statewide prevention efforts with PFS. She noted that with the Idaho Health Youth Survey allows communities to get their data back. She requested assistance in getting local schools support to have the school survey. <p>Sub-Committee Reports</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children’s Mental Health – Debbie Nadeau said the subcommittee met at 12:30 to 1:30 today. Great discussion on what everyone has going on in their own areas. Next month they intend to review the mission statement, goals and strategies put together for this year. May have to tweak some due to the COVID issues. There are two new parent representatives this month. Amy Fine shared that Sources of Strength being done in Skyway Elementary. North Idaho Trauma Care Collaborative will be reconvening. Joyce Broadsword added that there will be survey to see how COVID is impacting youth mental health. They are seeing a hesitancy of people coming in to seek treatment.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adult Behavioral Health - Kasey Nixon is stepping down as the chairperson and is looking for another person to take his place. Would be good to discuss who can step into that role. Joy asked Kasey for the group membership list so she can solicit for a chairperson. • Housing – Greg provided an update. Port of Hope building was purchased by an individual and is currently housing 14 people there. The warming center budget are about \$12-15,000 short of their \$40,000 budget. The Kroc Center donated \$20,000 and 30 bunkbeds. Biggest issue is dealing with COVID. If someone comes to the center ill they will be housed in a hotel, for which the City of Coeur d’Alene has pledged \$12,000. Greg noted the warming center needs to screen each person and will need a medically trained person as well as the PPE that goes along with that. Warming centers open at 23 degrees out. Plan and budget for 60 to 75 days per year for the warming center. City has been working on CARES act funding. If someone is symptomatic or waiting on a COVID test, that person cannot be co-mingled at the warming center. There is a need to solve onsite diagnostics and PPE. People arrive at 6, lights are out at 10 PM, most arrive around at 8 PM. Jill Ainsworth suggested contacting the MRC for a medical volunteer to provide testing and noted that Idaho University may have rapid test kits available. • PFS – Amy Hirtle presented three highlights from this month. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Don’t hang on to Meds program. – Have over 1,000 people clicking thorough go to the webpage ○ Increase in phone calls on how to get rid of sharps and medications. Campaign is focusing on disposal ○ In the summer partnered with the Sandpoint teen center, and they are doing great ○ New campaign is a billboard on Seltice Way and I90, for the Be the Parents. ○ Debbie shared that they have about 800 THC test kits to share with Juvenile Probation. ○ Amy would like to connect with the schools, coffee shops that she can distribute Be the Parent coffee sleeves. She welcomes any leads. ○ Aria added that drug takeback day is coming on October 24th. If anybody needs any resources, let her know. She also reminded that next week, the third quarter CHIP meeting is coming up on Oct 14th on Zoom. ○ Kelsey shared grant funding opportunities “Preventing Overdose and Increasing Access to Harm Reduction Services during the COVID 19 Pandemic.” Partnering opportunities are available.
